

## An individual must be a verified member of at least one of the criteria listed below to participate in the Climate Justice Fellowship Plus Program:

- Displaced homemakers
- Low-income individuals
- Indians, Alaska Natives, and Native Hawaiians.
  "Indian" is a member of a federally recognized Indian tribe.
- Individuals with disabilities (includes individuals who are in receipt of Social Security Disability Insurance)
- Older individuals (55 years or older)
- Previously incarcerated individuals
- Individuals experiencing homelessness
- Individuals who have aged out of the foster care system
- Individuals who are English language learners or individuals who have low levels of literacy

- Individuals facing substantial cultural barriers
- Eligible migrant and seasonal farmworkers
- Individuals within two years of exhausting lifetime Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) eligibility
- Single parents (including single pregnant persons)
- Long-term unemployed individuals
- 16- to 24-year-olds who are enrolled in or have completed a comprehensive work preparedness training program. The training program must include a combination of rigorous clean energy education with hands-on technical training.
- Incumbent or unemployed fossil fuel workers
